## BRIDGING POLICY SILOS IN THE DIGITAL FIELD

#### SECURITY

Focus: access to data for protection of national security and the fight against crime

Concerns: too strong encryption by industry and users can limit access to data

Actors: security services, law, enforcement agencies, UNODC, Interpol, etc...

Focus: developing standards, technologies and apps for data management

Concerns: fragmentation of the Internet due to restricted access to data for security and economic reasons

Actors: standardisation bodies (IETF, ISO, IEEE, ITU), technical associations, software developers

TECHNOLOGY

#### ECONOMY

Focus: processing data as a basis for a businessmodel

Concerns: loss of trust by users if data are shared with governments without legal constraints; increased privacy protection may reduce flexible use of users data (basis of business model)

> Actors: internet companies, business associations, WTO and trade policy community


Focus: protection of privacy and freedom of expression

Concerns: mass surveillance and lack of legal protection of citizens' data





Figure O.2 The pessimism concerning the global outlook is not because of digital technologies, but in spite of them


#### a. Global productivity

Five-year moving average of median growth of labor productivity per hour worked, in percent, in 87 countries




#### b. Global inequality
