Thank you for speaking briefly over the phone with me. As I explained, I am seeking more information about whether a particular NIST project when through a process for protection of human subjects, such as IRB review.

The NIST program is called Tatt-C, or the Tattoo Recognition Technology Challenge

Tatt-C provided 19 private companies and research institutions with a dataset of tattoo images for experimenting with tattoo recognition algorithms. Based on what I've seen so far, I believe that many, if not most, of the images are from prisoners. Based on my reading of the Common Rule and NIST's own guidelines, prisoners are a protected class and generally trigger IRB review without exception.

What I'd like to know is if Tatt-C did go through that process, and, if so, what kind of records of that review I may be able to examine.

I've been trying to gain information on this for quite sometime, so whatever you can do to help I would very much appreciate it.
