Please be advised that this is the fourth interim release as ordered by the court on May 7, 2007 for documents concerning surveillance systems known as DCS-3000 and Red Hook.

A decision has not been made concerning your request for a waiver of fees. We will be corresponding with you concerning that request in the near future. In the interim, we are providing you with the enclosed documents. Pursuant to Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 16.11, there is a fee of ten cents per page for duplication. No fees are assessed for the first 100 pages. If it is determined that you do not qualify for a fee waiver, duplication fees will be assessed accordingly.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;

- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or

this sounds as though it is the correct 3W amp...however, some of those amps had a power connector that appears to be very similar to an [redacted] connector. In the past, these types of connectors routinely failed - that is they failed to provide consistent contact with the power connector that is mounted to the amp. if your guy is dealing with this type of connector, I would strongly suggest that he attempt to verify power connectivity - preferably by monitoring the amount of current the amp is drawing during transmit (connecting it to a DC plug that has a current gauge, or, by inserting a current meter in series with either the

power or ground wire). past experience shows that even when the amp felt 'warm' to the touch it was not operating consistently, but rather intermittently - hence the sometimes work other time not work experience....i'm not saying that this is the problem, only that it's a good place to start looking.

also, not meaning to sound condescending but, sometimes in the 'heat of battle' cables are connected improperly - that is, the IN gets connected to the OUT and vice versa...always verify that the hardware is properly installed whenever you feel things aren't working properly. One last thing to validate is whether or not the AMP was enabled on the software...

The amp came with a quick reference guide that shows how the amp should be hooked up to a [redacted] [redacted]. On the reverse side of the guide it shows [redacted] connections". The amp base plate is 10-12 inches long and three inches wide. It has an [redacted] in connection on one end and an [redacted] out connection on the opposite end. It also has a plug for 12VDC in on the same end as the [redacted] in connection. There are two large screws on either end of the base plate that allow it to be screwed into the [redacted]. There are twelve thin black rectangular pieces sticking straight up from the amp which is centered on the base plate. The rectangles are approximately two inches high and three inches long. There is NO fan for the amp. The amp is of the same design as the 3 watt amp that we had in Chantilly prior to being given a 10 watt amp.

Good morning Mr. Clifford,

I have been meaning to stop by and run an idea by you, but the timing hasn't worked-out and I didn't want to delay much longer as I know you are extremely busy. I would like to propose an idea I have that will help WITT in accomplishing its mission. I have broached this topic with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] on several occasions over the past several months, so I don't believe I'm jumping the chain-of-command here, and I hope I'm not coming-across as too ignorant with what I am about to propose.

I have been exploring the possibility of moving the WITT Program from ESTS to TOS, PSU and rename the Unit as the "Covert Tracking Unit". I am providing below some bullet-point thoughts as to why this type of reorganization would enhance WITT's ability to provide better cell tracking support to the Field.

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1. TTA's that are WITT-trained are more often-than-not also GPS tracker-trained [REDACTED] Program). They are very familiar with WINTRACK (which WITT also uses as its principal geo-track software) and will probably begin using some of our equipment (the Tracking Vans, for instance) for their GPS tracking operations, regardless of whether it is a WITT project or a GPS Tracking project because this integration of resources makes sense to them. Also, some of the same skill-sets that the average Tech Agent does not always possess regarding surveillance techniques is common among GPS and WITT Tech Agents; the mind-set of being more proactive and less of a "plant-type" Tech Agent is a common thread. With fewer Tech Agents available, it seems logical to harness the common skills required of each Program.

2. As you are well aware of, there is quite a bit of cell phone tracking that is reliant on GPS technologies these days, especially as more cell phones come equipped with GPS receivers at little extra charge to the customers. Relocation of WITT would provide elbow-to-elbow access with PSU's GPS expertise and knowledgebase.

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3. We have a portion of WITT that is already committed to ensuring that we constantly explore the information available on the networks that enable our WITT to be much more efficient and effective with the equipment. Our Engineers [redacted] are very familiar with the DCS-3000 program and our connections with them have existed since WITT was formed. Our Carrier Liaison program is launched and has a good working relationship and respect for the Engineers who created it.

4. An economy of use of resources (both money and personnel) could be realized, as we are all tasked to do more with less. I believe the [redacted] is in the process of taking steps to collocate these programs of theirs, partly due to recognition of this fact.

5. All of ATU except for WITT will be moving to the far-end of the building soon. WITT will remain in the same pod as PSU, just one floor up.

These are the primary reasons for my belief that WITT would be more effective if we were relocated. I have some ideas regarding a plan for how this reorganization could take place, if you feel there is merit in exploring this idea further.

As a side issue, it has come to my attention that our engineers (our backbone) are seriously considering employment elsewhere [redacted] after he completes his [redacted] has other issues that I believe you are aware of). I sincerely believe that this type of reorganization will galvanize this program into refocusing on the increasingly-demanding and growing work that is in front of it. I believe it is in the FBI's best interests to make every effort to keep these seasoned cell phone tracking support employees and welcome any ideas you have; we could use all the help we can get these days.

Unfortunately, CALEA-compliant switches do not inform LEAs when the target phone powers off - only when it powers up, which is one type of registration event that is reported via CALEA.

If we're authorized in the future to deliver target-specific data to the van, then it would probably make the most sense to deliver all the information; visa-vis, a DCS-3000 Client in the van. This way your vendor will not have to bother trying to interpret the many variations of CALEA pen-register data (which means less development cost and time for your group), and the van teams will have all the available call information in a format consistent with the CMP system.

witt has been trying to integrate [REDACTED] with the tracking vehicles for over a year but to no avail (this timeframe does not include previous attempts as i have had a contract and funding in place for this to happen for over two years) - simply due to the lack of support from the switch based intercept team (sbit) and their reluctance to provide documentation and test data available from the dcs system. technically speaking, witt has had and still does have the necessary resources to make this a reality - unfortunately, without the proper documentation and test data it couldn't be done. repeated verbal requests from witt were ignored and met with apparent obstructionism. more recent email requests finally yeilded a single piece of paper, entitled EVENT MESSAGE DEFINITIONS - CALL DATA CHANNEL. still, to date, no sample test data or even examples of message structures have been provided. it should be noted that witt has even broached this technique with security division and has received a 'preliminary' approval - this occured well over a year ago.

based upon these and other events - one possible explanation is that the consensus of certain personnel is that this and other projects were too technically complex for witt to manage. if this is true, i personally disagree. another is that its such a great idea that 'lets do it ourselves' - in my opinion, the later appears to be more appropriate.

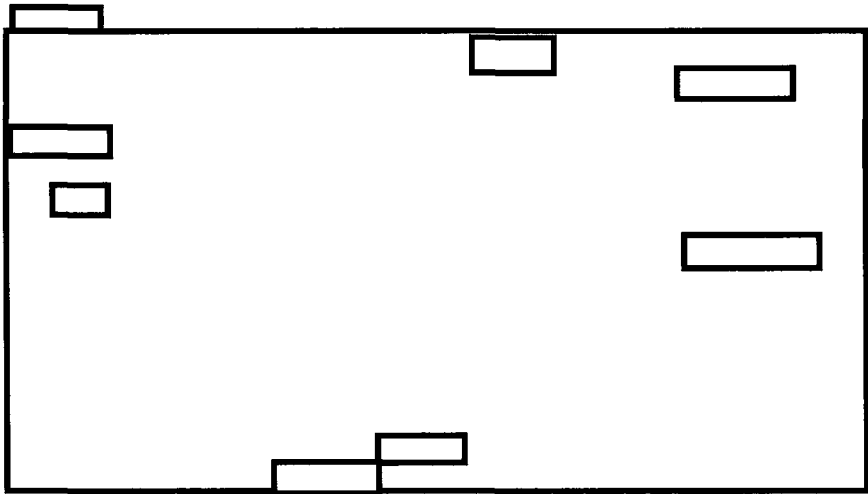

PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO WINTRACK SOFTWARE APPLICATION

The purpose of this document is to identify in technical detail those capabilities that are desired by the Telecommunications Intercept and Collection Technology Unit but currently unavailable in the [Redacted] Software Application.

This Engineering Task will be two-fold (i.e., consisting of the development of two unique features that will operate independently of one another but ultimately compliments each other).

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TASK #1

PROBLEM: [Redacted] supports only one instance of [Redacted]

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Laboratory testing conducted by TICTU personnel ET [Redacted] and EE [Redacted] uncovered a 'glitch' in [Redacted] ability to simultaneously display multiple instances of [Redacted] information. [Redacted] will display the correct geographical coordinates of multiple instances of [Redacted] data - this is NOT the problem. The problem occurs when a user attempts to include multiple instances of [Redacted] assigned for use with multiple instances of [Redacted]

It appears that a [Redacted] instance is automatically 'linked' to the [Redacted] instance that is designated as [Redacted]. Therefore ALL subsequent [Redacted] instances 'track' on the coordinates of the [Redacted] instance that is designated as [Redacted]. The user is unable to independently assign a [Redacted] instance with an [Redacted] instance and ultimately sees multiple [Redacted] displays all associated with the [Redacted] instance designated as [Redacted]

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[Redacted] ability to properly display the correct [Redacted] is NOT an issue. Testing verified that [Redacted] display the correct information - but only at the wrong [Redacted] instance.
