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


As you've probably gathered by now, the two documents below are the GCapproved submissions that went across the street to DOJ last December--(1) the WP document that's the Master List of all FBI legislative proposals (the ECPA proposal being third from the end) and (2) the WORD document that was an attachment to the Master List.


Each of the above comports with our October 2006 submissions to OCA. **HOWEVER**, when I compare them to the language that DOJ is currently proposing (i.e., the language that Julie sent to us this morning via Internet Cafe), I see some differences. That's where your assistance would be extremely helpful.

Julie needs to know ASAP how the DOJ proposal compares to ours and to what extent the differences really do matter.

Given that you're the one who put together this particular proposal, your comments would be critical.

DOJ wants us to review their proposed language regarding the Electronic Communications Privacy Act (ECPA)--specifically, their "proposed amendment to implement the change in the ECPA definition of 'toll billing records' suggested by the IG."

As you know, OGC has previously made such proposals--multiple times, as I recall. Most recently, we submitted a proposal to you on 23 October 2006. The relevant portion of that proposal is set forth below and emphasized in bold.

Specifically, on page 1 of your Statement, there was a reference to the "Portland Seven" as an NSL success story. However, as the e-mail string (below) indicates, that particular case was not a good example after all.


I learned of the issue today when called me to inquire how the reference to the "Portland Seven" found its way into your testimony. He advised weren't comfortable with that reference and that they were that CTD folks interested in learning how and why it was used. In particular, they wanted to know because they're currently working on comments for the Director's SJC testimony on 27 March.

As you'll recall, you did NOT include any NSL "success stories" in your initial DRAFT--nor did we in NSLB include them in any of our comments. Instead, they were subsequently inserted by others, per DOJ's request, before your Statement "went final."


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



So, OCA turned to the NSL-related Q&As that OPA had published on their website following the release of the IG's Report. That's where they found the examples that they inserted in the testimony. And, that's why I visited in OPA this afternooni.e., for her help in determining OPA's source of information.

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





I conferred with OCA's Action Officer yesterday. We agreed that our submission to OCA could await the return of Julie and next week.



This morning, **GC Caproni approved the two legislative proposals** (below) for submission to OCA and then DOJ. (As you may recall, we hope to submit another proposal on an unrelated topic later this morning.)



2. Right to Financial Privacy Act, 15 U.S.C. 1681u(a) and (b). NSLs under these two provisions enable the FBI to obtain credit bureau information--i.e., the identity of financial institutions where a consumer maintains or maintained an account, and consumer-identifying information (including names associated with the person, current and former addresses and places of employment). In contrast, Sec. 1681v (which the USA PATRIOT Act added to the FCRA) authorizes NSLs to obtain a full "consumer report of a consumer and all other information in a consumer's file"--but only in international terrorism cases. Full consumer reports in counterintelligence cases, on the other hand, require court orders. PROPOSAL:

If you could, PLEASE cc me on that missive so that I will know who to try and contact with any further questions.

We are looking for ideas that you would like to see the Department of Justice work, on behalf of the FBI, before Members of Congress during the 110th Session. <u>I am attaching</u> <u>an example of a proposal idea</u> with this message, and ask that to the best of your ability, you tailor any suggestions you have to fit into this format and include as much of the requested information as you can.
