b7C Here's the background on the request I received from [redacted] July 11, 2006.

[redacted] asked me to give him a total number of [redacted] explained that our initial naming convention for processing data did not include the authority used so the numbers and information I can give him will be an approximation. This approximation is also based on the allotted time to complete request.

I created the following documents:

- A powerpoint document giving the total approximate number of NSLs received by carriers from Sept 2004 to July 2006. The number was generated based on our current naming convention that includes the type of authority in the directory name.
- A document generated includes a listing of all the directory names with the known type of authority included in the directory name. Each directory represents either an NSL or FGJ response.

b1 (S) - A document created was an expanded directory listing of all the raw data [redacted] This listing included all authorities and listed [redacted] all file names in each directory.
