
- a. Dissemination of Foreign Intelligence Information to Federal, State, Local and Tribal Officials and Agencies (U)
  - i. The FBI may disseminate FISA BR material, and any summaries, analysis, or other information or reporting derived from such material, that reasonably appear to constitute foreign intelligence information, or to be necessary to understand foreign intelligence information or assess its importance, to federal, state, local and tribal officials and agencies with responsibilities directly related to the material proposed to be disseminated. Material that reasonably appears to be foreign intelligence information not directly related to responsibilities of such officials and agencies may be disseminated incidental to the dissemination of material directly related to responsibilities of such officials and agencies. Such material may be disseminated only consistent with the need of the United States to obtain, produce, and disseminate foreign intelligence information. (U)

- e. Dissemination of Foreign Intelligence Information or Evidence of a Crime to Private Entities and Individuals. (U)
  - i. The FBI may disseminate FISA BR material that is foreign intelligence information or evidence of a crime to private entities and individuals to:
    - 1. obtain assistance in acquiring foreign intelligence information;
    - 2. obtain assistance in preventing or investigating any activities listed at 50 U.S.C. § 1801(b);

- 3. identify or obtain assistance in identifying entities and individuals that have been, are being, or reasonably may be affected by such activities; or
- 4. notify or obtain assistance in notifying entities and individuals that have been, are being, or reasonably may be affected by such activities. (U)
