(J.P.M.L.), attached as Exhibit A. In these cases, the United States challenges the authority of state officials to seek information from telecommunications carriers about alleged foreign intelligence activities of the United States on the grounds, *inter alia*, that such state demands are precluded by the Constitution and preempted by federal law. The Panel found "these six actions involve common questions of fact with the actions in this litigation previously centralized in the Northern District of California, and that transfer of the six actions to the Northern District of California for inclusion in the coordinated or consolidated pretrial proceedings in that district will serve the convenience of the parties and witnesses." *Id.* at 2.

Upon the transfer of these cases, the United States respectfully requests a status conference to determine the proper course for their expeditious resolution, including the possibility of consolidated briefing and oral argument. Unlike the other cases consolidated in these proceedings, the United States does not believe that these six cases should be stayed pending the appeal of *Hepting v. AT&T*, 439 F. Supp. 2d 974 (N.D. Cal. 2006), *appeal docketed* Nos. 06-80109, 80110 (9th Cir.).
