On an international agreement was struck between DHS and the EU in 2004 governing CBP's access to PNR from the EU. The agreement was quickly challenged in court by the European Parliament. On 5/30/05 the European Court of Justice ruled that the EU inappropriately entered into this agreement on the grounds that the 1995 Directive did not apply. *b5*

(V) On 7/3/06, the Finnish Presidency and the Commission terminated the agreement effective 9/30/06. The Finnish Presidency also received a mandate from the European Council to negotiate a replacement agreement by 9/30. The Commission presented the USG with a proposed text on 7/16.
