### **GLOSSARY**

ABI	Automated Broker Interface. An automated system that provides the communication link to transmit entry and entry summary data on imported merchandise between all ABI users, brokers, importers,
ACE	carriers, port authorities, computer service centers, and ACS.  Automated Commercial Environment, a U.S. Customs and Border Protection automated system that employs features such as account management, remote filing, and compliance measurement.
ACS	Automated Commercial System, a U.S. Customs and Border Protection automated system. ABI and AMS are among the 18 modules that are operational under the ACS umbrella.
AES	Automated Export System, a joint venture between U.S. Customs and Border Protection and the Bureau of the Census that resulted in the implementation of an information gateway designed to assure compliance with and enforcement of laws related to exporting.
Air Waybill	A bill of lading for air shipments that is filed on an Air Manifest. It is used heavily by freight forwarders and is used primarily on passenger aircraft.
AMS	Automated Manifest System, an automated system that provides the communication link to transmit manifests between the carrier and ACS. This system also interfaces with ABI and the Cargo Selectivity System.
Analyst	U.S. Customs and Border Protection personnel who perform analysis and are authorized to build targeting rules.
APIS	Advance Passenger Information System. Data from this U.S. Customs and Border Protection computer system is accessible by ATS-P (Passenger) for running queries and producing reports.
BICE	The Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement. One of the successors, along with U.S. Customs and Border Protection, to the United States Customs Service.
Bill	Bill of Lading document. A document that provides the terms of the contract between the shipper and the transportation company to move freight between stated points at a specific charge.
Body cavity search	Any visual or physical intrusion into the rectal or vaginal cavity.
Broker	Person who is licensed to transact U.S. Customs and Border Protection business on behalf of others.
Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement	The agency within the Border and Transportation Security directorate of the Department of Homeland Security responsible for criminal investigation and enforcement, as well as enforcement of immigration and customs laws.
Button	A simulated button on a screen that is "pushed" by clicking it with the mouse and when selected allows a user to view a particular associated object
BXA	Bureau of Export Administration.
Cargo	All commercially carried material offered for entry into the United States, except baggage in the possession of an arriving passenger. A cargo area is kept separate from passengers and their baggage. It is an area where freight is stored and kept in U.S. Customs and Border Protection custody pending release.

Carrier	A business entity that moves freight (cargo) for compensation, for example, truck lines, airline, steamship company, and railroad.

Compliance Measurement	Statistical methodology composed of sampling techniques used to determine levels of compliance with U.S. and U.S. Customs and Border Protection laws and regulations measurable at ports of entry. Compliance Measurements may occur at the industry or commodity level, or may be tailored for a specific account or trade issue.
Consignee	The person or firm to who merchandise is destined.
Consignment	Merchandise sent to a retailer who is expected to pay after the sale occurs.
Container	A pre-assembled unit for shipping merchandise, such as a lift van, cargo container, tank, etc., which may be designated by the Commissioner of Customs as an Instrument of International Traffic (10.41a CR).
Countervailing Duty	Payments or bestowals of bounties or grants on any articles or merchandise imported into the United States from a foreign country.
Country of Export	Usually, but not necessarily, the country in which the merchandise was manufactured or produced and from which it was first exported. Note, for example, that for merchandise made in Switzerland and shipped to the U.S. through Bremen, Germany, the country of exportation would be Switzerland.
Country of Origin	The country of manufacture, production, or growth of the article.
CSI	Container Security Initiative. Developed by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, CSI involves CBP officers working with foreign nations to target high-risk cargo containers. CSI includes the use of intelligence and automated information, pre-screening of high-risk containers, and use of smarter, tamper-proof containers.
CST	Commodity Specialist Team.
Date of Export	The date on which the merchandise actually leaves for the United States. If the vessel with merchandise on board departs from two or more ports of the country of exportation, the date the vessel finally leaves the last port of the exporting country is the date of exportation.
	When merchandise is shipped from an interior country through the ports of another country, the date of exportation is the date on which the merchandise crosses the border of the country of exportation.
Departing Airport	The last scheduled departing point of the arriving flight into the United States.
ECAR	Entry and Clearance Aircraft Report. Information stored within the Automated Commercial System (ACS) that is used by the Automated Targeting System.
