The FBI does not currently have an application ready to house this information; however, the counterterrorism and counterintelligence programs consider this information critical. As a short term solution, we are discussing creating text documents from the structured fields. The documents would look very similar to how the teletypes look now, and they would be distributed to the operational divisions by the Communications Center just like the teletypes are now. The documents would also be uploaded into ACS and IDW so field offices can access them quickly.	
The question is this: The teletypes now come from as text documents and are placed into ACS in that format. Can the FBI, from a records management rules perspective, convert data which will come in a structured format into text documents and place them into an ACS file? has advised they will discontinue sending the teletypes at the end of October so we're on a short deadline. It is noted the FBI signed an MOU in July 2004 which started this process. Under that agreement could have stopped the teletypes in January 2005 but they've taken pity on us because we weren't ready then. Here is what I received from MITRE:

The open source data collected for the FBI comes from the MiTAP system run by San Diego State University (SDSU). MiTAP is a complex system written by MITRE that collects raw data from the internet, standardizes the format, extracts named entities, and routes documents into appropriate newsgroups. Although the system was designed to collect foreign language data and process it with machine translation, right now all of the data collected is from English language sources.

The MiTAP system at SDSU collects the data, processes it and makes the data available via a nntp news server. MITRE has a script that checks the server for new news, collects it, packages it into a format suitable for transport and post the data to a web site for (password controlled) download. The server is checked frequently for new data and new packages are posted for download three times a day.

As agreed to by our Office of General Counsel, this process was intended to be temporary – really more of a proof of concept. A better long term solution would be for the FBI to run its own copy of MiTAP and manage its data collections directly. We could certainly help you do that.

IDW Background

- The Investigative Data Warehouse (IDW) is a single point of entry for accessing FBI and non-FBI data sets
- The IDW project initiative will ultimately integrate many of the underlying system data sources to support FBI data mining and target searching as well as selective sharing with other Federal agencies.
- It is the forerunner of an FBI Enterprise Data Warehouse which will be a true repository of data for investigative, intelligence and administrative activities.
- IDW 1.1 fully operational system with limited data
 - ATO: July 2004, release to IRD in FY-05 for O&M
- IDW 2.0 will have additional data and capabilities
 - In development thru FY-05, estimated IOC in May 05


Why We Need to Move Beyond IDW 1

- There are two implementations, IDW-S and CTD/SPT
 - Different tool versions and data sets result in custom systems as opposed to one enterprise system
- IDW 1 lacks a formal FBI policy framework for governance, authorization of data sources, access by personnel to specific data sets, approved requirements, and OGC-approved Privacy Impact Assessment
- IDW 1 is a collection of separate data sets, not an integrated warehouse -- analysts cannot perform integrated search and correlation across all data sets
- There are no discretionary access controls all the users can see all the data all the time
- Data access limitations include locked out ACS files and excluded case classifications


