Dear Ms. Hoffmann:

This is in final response to your October 2008 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for documents of communications between Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) employees and representatives of the printing industry, printer/copier manufacturing industries, trade associations, researchers, the Central Bank Counterfeit Deterrence Group, as well as documentation of visits and travel between BEP employees and printer/copier hardware and software manufacturers. Enclosed please find the two page document list and six hundred fifty (650) pages of information in response to your request.

Pursuant to the exemption found at 5 U.S.C. 552 b(6), we are withholding the names, addresses and signatures of meeting participants. We feel that the release of this information would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of their personal privacy.

The actual cost to respond to your request easily exceeded two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), however we accepted your revised fee agreement limit of \$150.00. The cost to respond to your request consists of:

Washington, DC. 20228, within 35 days of receipt of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal."
