Dear Ms. Hofmann:

This is in response to your fax, dated 25 February 2008, received in the Information Management Services Center of the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) on 26 February 2008. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), you requested "...copies of all reports submitted by the National Reconnaissance Office to the Intelligence Oversight Board ("IOB") pursuant to Section 2.4 of Executive Order 12863..."

Your request was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. A thorough search of our files and databases located 8 records, totaling 20 pages, responsive to your request. Two of the records, totaling 8 pages, are being denied in full. Four documents, consisting of 8 pages, are being released in part. The two remaining documents, comprising 4 pages, are being released in full.

Material withheld is denied pursuant to FOIA exemptions:

- -(b)(1) as properly classified information under Executive Order 12958, Section 1.4(c);
- -(b)(3) which allows the withholding of information prohibited from disclosure by statute, 10 U.S.C. § 424 which states: "Except as required by the President or as provided in subsection (c), no provision of law shall be construed to require the disclosure of (1) The organization or any function . . .(2) . . . number of persons employed by or assigned or detailed to any such organization or the name, official title, occupational series, grade, or salary of any such person . . . (b) Covered Organizations . . . the National Reconnaissance Office;" and

-(b)(3) which applies to information specifically exempt by statute, specifically 50 U.S.C. § 403-1, which protects intelligence sources and methods from unauthorized disclosure.

The FOIA authorizes federal agencies to assess fees for record services. Based upon the information provided, you have been placed in the "educational/scientific/media" category of requesters, which means you are responsible for duplication fees (.15 per page) exceeding 100 pages. In this case, no fees were incurred.

You have the right to appeal this determination by addressing your appeal to the NRO Appeal Authority, 14675 Lee Road, Chantilly, VA 20151-1715 within 60 days of the date of this letter. Should you decide to do so, please explain the basis of your appeal.

(U) This letter is submitted pursuant to Section 2.4 of Executive Order 12863 and covers the period of 1 April to 30 June 2004. Information in the report meets the reporting standard of Executive Order 12863 or may be of general interest to the Board. I would like to advise you of the following matter which has come to my attention during the reporting period.

# (U) <u>Urgent Concern Regarding Alleged Mishandling of</u> Classified Equipment and Information

(U//FOUO) On June 21, 2004 the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO), Office of Inspector General (OIG) received information from an NRO employee requesting to invoke the "Whistleblower" process provided in the Inspector General Act of 1978 as amended in order to present an "urgent concern", as defined in that act, to the intelligence oversight committees of the Congress. The NRO OIG presented this information to the Department of Defense OIG, which in turn found it "credible" and so informed the Secretary of Defense. The Secretary, in turn, has presented this urgent concern to the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) and the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI).

(U//FOUO) The information presented alleges that a laptop computer that could contain classified information is missing at an NRO facility. The information also alleges broader problems in the handling of classified equipment and information. The NRO OIG has begun an

investigation to determine whether the allegations are true, and to determine what, if any, corrective and disciplinary actions are required.
